Where are we?

Edmonds Community College is a public two-year college 24 kilometers north of Seattle. It is situated on a beautiful 50-acre campus in the safe, suburban community of Lynnwood, Washington. Nearby are shops, banks, apartments, cafes and restaurants.

Our community

Edmonds Community College is 25 minutes north of downtown Seattle and 45 minutes north of the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport. Located in the Pacific Northwest of the United States, we are about 1.5 hours from Vancouver, Canada, and minutes away from beaches and waterfront parks on the beautiful Puget Sound.

Our campus is in a safe, quiet, suburb of Seattle and provides the perfect environment for students to study. It is located on a beautiful 50-acre campus that includes a golf course. The campus is within walking distance to stores, banks, and restaurants.

Lynnwood features the Alderwood Mall shopping center with theaters, major national stores, and an eclectic mix of restaurants.

Nearby Edmonds is a quiet town on the shore of Puget Sound, a major inlet of the Pacific Ocean. It offers a wide range of boutique restaurants, shopping, art galleries, and a ferry boat terminal to the Olympic Peninsula, where the Olympic National Park is located.

The Seattle area – home to The Boeing Company, Microsoft Corporation, Starbucks Coffee Company, and Amazon.com Inc. – is a major U.S. business and cultural center. It's also home to professional sports, such as the Mariners baseball team, the Sounders FC soccer team, and the Seahawks football team.

Seattle is a major metropolitan city known for innovation and new ideas in technology, arts, business, and culture. Outstanding theatre, opera, symphony, contemporary concerts, and art exhibitions are trademarks of Seattle; and it's only a short drive to world-class skiing, boating, and hiking. The city's restaurants are well known for a cuisine that blends European and Asian styles of cooking.

High school to university

Complete your high school diploma and earn college credit at the same time. If you are 16 years old or older, you can join our high school to university program. Many classes are college Associate's degree classes that count toward a high school diploma and Bachelor's degree.

Edmonds Community College started the international high school program in 1993 and has graduated more than 500 students in the dual Diploma/Associate's degree program. We are the most experienced college in the U.S. with this program.

Professional degrees and work experience

Earn a professional degree in two years and /or a certificate in as little as six months. Degrees can be used to transfer to university Bachelor's degree programs or to start working in a career.

Work in the U.S. through optional practical training.

After completing a degree or certificate, you may work in the U.S. in your area of study for up to a year before transferring to a university or returning home through the Optional Practical Training program. After completing a Bachelor's degree in a professional area, you can work an additional year in the U.S. before returning home.

The TOEFL or any other test is NOT required to enter our college classes. Instead, take our English placement test on arrival and enter a college academic program or, if needed, you'll take English classes to get ready for college.

Students with TOEFL IBT 55, CBT 157 or PBT 480 or better, IELTS 5.0 overall in each band, or Cambridge First Certificate, grades A, B, and C enter directly to a college academic program and take college/university transfer classes.

You must be 16 years old or have graduated from high school to apply.
