BACKGROUND 2022-23 COLLEGE PRIORITIES

Subject

Board of Trustees approval of the 2022-23 College Priorities.

Background

Within the context of the college's Comprehensive Planning Structure, there are 6 overarching goals. For 2022-23, 15 strategies¹ have been prioritized under these goals. These 15 strategies, which along with the 6 goals form the 2022-23 College Priorities, were developed by the President's Leadership Team with opportunity for input and feedback from the College Leadership Team and other stakeholders.

33 actions have been identified to impact the desired target lead metrics of the 15 strategies. Those action items are assigned across the college and are monitored at the departmental level as well as by the President's Leadership Team.

The college uses leading and lagging metrics to monitor progress on a set of identified targets. Strategic lead metrics have been established and actions have been identified to impact these metrics. Lead metrics then ultimately impact larger lag metrics, which are moved by the progress of strategies and show the impact of the overarching goals. This methodology of tying the college's Comprehensive Plan components horizontally as well as vertically, is key to the plan's success. Progress reports will be produced periodically for campus and the Board.

Recommendation

The President's Leadership Team recommends the Edmonds College Board of Trustees approve the 2022-23 College Priorities, as they flow from the Comprehensive Plan Goals, as outlined on the following page.

To establish and approve the 2023 schedule of Edmonds College Board of Trustees meetings.

Background

In compliance with RCW 42.30.075, it is necessary that the Edmonds College Board of Trustees adopt a meeting schedule to be kept on file in the Office of the Code Reviser in Olympia.

In accordance with Board Policy 1.0 BOT Bylaws, Section 2, Meetings, which states that "The Board of Trustees will hold a minimum of six regular meetings and four study sessions during the calendar year. The day of the month, time, and place for the regular meetings and study sessions shall be set at the first fall meeting," regularly scheduled meetings will generally be held on the second Thursday of the month with exceptions as needed. Each meeting date will be confirmed at the previous month's Board meeting.

Unless the Board of Trustees would like to revise the usual meeting time at the September 15, 2023 meeting, meetings are generally scheduled to begin at 3:30pm and last for three hours. Exceptions to this schedule are noted below.

Meeting location will be dependent upon COVID-19 guidance from state and local officials, as well as the College administration determination if in-person meetings can be held safely. At this time, meetings are planned to take place in person. The location for in-person meetings will generally be Edmonds College, Gateway Hall 352, 6600 196th SW, Lynnwood, WA, unless otherwise noted. Meetings that are held remotely will take place via Zoom. The location of the meeting will be noted on the agenda which is posted on the website in advance of the meeting.

FOUNDATION REPORT

FOUNDATION ACTIVITY

- The Foundation has engaged consultants to facilitate a strategic planning process scheduled to kick off in mid-September. The process will include 3 phases: Discovery and analysis; strategy development; and plan activation. The plan will be implemented mid-February 2023.
- This summer, the Foundation developed a 3-year marketing communication plan. The plan focuses on creating a consistent communication strategy to keep our multiple audiences aware of and engaged with the Foundation.
- The Foundation engaged a database consultant to provide guidance on organizing and updating existing records.
- The Foundation awarded 140 scholarship recipients for the 2022/23 academic year totaling \$250K.
- The Foundation approved a budget for FY 22-23. Forecasted expenses, including College support, will be \$1.3 million.
- The 2022 Faculty and staff awards, funded by the Foundation, were awarded at the Convocation. Congratulations to recipients:

 - Barbara Patterson Exempt Employee to Beth Farley and Chris Russ

 - Innovation Leadership Award to Elisabeth Frederickson
- The Board of Trustees awarded the Excellence in Education Award to Judge Theresa Pouley.

FUNDRAISING

- The Foundation experienced an extremely successful year raising *\$1.4 million* in 2021-2022.
- For 2022-2023, The Verdant Health Commission awarded the Foundation a \$240,000 second-year grant (of a 3-year renewable grant) for the CRC Mental Health Expansion project effective July 1, 2022.
- The INSPIRE 2023 fundraising event is set for April 22, 2023 at the Lynnwood Convention Center. Mark your calendars!
- The 2022 President's Circle reception will be held as a Gratitude Coffee and Dessert Reception on campus on November 1, 2022 where guests can pick up their gratitude boxes (or have them delivered the next day if not attending). The Foundation will resume the President's Circle annual event in 2023.
