What's up with Horticulture at Edmonds CC?

Certificates (one-year programs)

- **Ornamental Horticulture**
A solid foundation in the field and preparation for employment in the landscape industry.
- **Nursery Growers**
A foundation and vocational training in subjects and skills relevant to the growing and production of greenhouse and nursery ornamental plants.

Associate of Technical Arts Degrees (two-year programs)

- **Nursery/Greenhouse**
Prepares students for careers in plant propagation, nursery production, wholesaling and facility management.
- **Landscape Design**
Prepares students to practice in a landscape design firm or to begin their own business.
- **Landscape Management**
Learn how to maintain, install and renovate private, public and commercial sites.
- **Restoration Horticulture**
Learn how to replant natural areas by designing, establishing, and stewarding native plant communities.

Choose from day, evening, weekend, hybrid and online classes!

There's something for everyone – enthusiastic gardener, degree-seeker or industry professional.

Our goal is to offer students hands-on field experience while providing an excellent learning environment in the classroom. Classes are small enough to allow individual attention.

Begin any quarter and start with one or more classes! If you work weekdays, you may take classes or obtain your degree in the evening, Saturdays, and online. Select from a wide variety of classes, building on an individual degree program suited to your unique interests and abilities.

About 40% of our students choose to take only evening classes; about 60% of students are already working in the field, with 40% of those working already owning their own business. Our students range from young adults to senior citizens, with an average age of 40.
