HOW TO GET A ROOM

- 1. Fill out an application at edmonds.edu/housing/apply.
- 2. Register with Edmonds College to be a student.
- 3. Be 16 or older for either Homestay or Residence Hall
- 4. Check your email one month before the college arrival date(s) for confirmation.
- 5. Arrive on our official arrivals date and get ready to be part of our Edmonds community!

HOMESTAY

For the past 40 years, Edmonds College has worked closely with local families in our community through its Homestay program. By living with a family, students can make new friends and improve their English skills as they experience family life in the United States.

To ensure the safety of our students, families are carefully selected, interviewed, and a home inspection is conducted as part of the approval process. Every adult living in the Homestay family must go through a background check.

Ongoing support is provided to students placed in Homestay by Housing Office staff.
