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All Running Start students should follow the policies and procedures set forth by their high school and college, including meeting with their high school counselor AND college advisor prior to selecting courses. The equivalency chart below is a guide and students should work with their counselor and advisor to determine courses that meet their graduation requirements and post-high school goals.

- For all English course work at the 100 level or above, five quarter hours or three semester hours shall equal 1.0 high school credit.
- English 101 is *typically* required of all Running Start students. English 101 and English 102 will fulfill 11th and 12th grade English graduation requirements. Additional English courses may be taken to make up for past English credit deficiencies. *English 102 not available at Bellevue College
