
Please review and sign the attached articulation agreement that lays out the requirements and conditions.

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN
UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON
AND
EDMONDS COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

To create a clear and easy pathway for students of Edmonds Community College to transfer to and complete their baccalaureate degree at the University of Washington, the University of Washington and Edmonds Community College enter into this articulation agreement as follows:

1. In order for Edmonds Community College students to qualify for the transfer agreement they must:
 - a. Earn Edmonds Community College's Associate in Applied Science Transfer degree in Construction Management (EdCC CM)
 - b. As part of, or in addition to the EdCC CM degree, students shall have completed the following courses and credits (*provisional admittance will be granted to students without these classes but they must complete all credits in order to graduate with a Bachelor of Science in Construction Management*):

The courses listed in paragraph b. above shall be applied towards the EdCC CM degree to satisfy the Communication, Human Relations, Quantitative Analysis, Natural Science and Mathematics, and/or Program Electives as determined by the EdCC CM department.

Students may take these classes at Edmonds Community College, the University of Washington, or at another accredited institution. Students should consult with their program advisor before taking these classes at another institution.


- c. Students transferring from EdCC with a CM degree as outlined above shall be granted a waiver from taking the following University of Washington Construction Management courses below:

- d. EdCC CM graduates shall take a total of 113 college level coursework at Edmonds Community College. EdCC CM graduates shall take a total 78 credits of upper division coursework at the University of Washington
 - e. Achieve a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.7
 - f. Meet the admissions criteria for University of Washington in effect at the time of their application.
2. University of Washington will place students meeting the above criteria in a competitive pool for selection by the admission committee for:
 - a. Acceptance into our Bachelor of Science in Construction Management degree program;
 - b. Necessary academic advising to meet the program requirements; and
 - c. Transfer as a block of One Hundred-Two (102) quarter credits for the Bachelor of Applied Science in Construction Management.
 3. No financial commitment whatsoever, on the part of either signatory to this general document, is intended and implemented.
 4. This agreement shall remain in effect for a period of five (5) years from the date of the last signature, with the understanding that it may be terminated by the appropriate authorities of either party in writing with at least 90 days notice. Renewal of this agreement will be based on an evaluation of student success and review of Edmonds Community College's degree curriculum.

5. Students are responsible for all necessary documentation to attend the college.


